Rob Collins, director of the Christian Communications Institute of the university, and his wife, Esther Wakeman, who is a vice president and chaplain of the university as well. ## Eagle Scout Project Help

**M**y Eagle Scout project will provide handicap access to Westminster Hall. Through my conversations with Mr. Kephart, Building and Property chair, the church has identified this as a need for some time. Currently the only access for people not able to do the stairs is to enter Westminster Hall through the stage entrance and then to remain on the stage. If there was access to the floor of Westminster Hall, all people with the desire to attend meetings and programs in that room could attend and be more comfortable doing so.

I plan to install an electric lift in the back corner of the stage area where people could ride the lift to floor level and come out the side door of the stage and enter Westminster Hall. Unfortunately, this project is rather expensive. The church has offered to help me financially with it, but I still need to raise about \$5,000 to complete the project.

### Class descriptions:

**"Mission 2008: Pray It, Live It"** This session continues our Year-in-Mission theme in which our church develops mission outreaches for the year.
