Advent Schedule

The word **Advent** means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the season is preparation to celebrate the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. In addition to Sunday morning worship, SCPC has a number of events and programs that will help you prepare for Christmas. In fact, this year we are even going to help you prepare for Advent - which is preparing to prepare! We hope you will be able to use some or all of these events to prepare yourself for the celebration of Christ's birth.

Pre-Advent Soup Supper - Tuesday, November 25, 5:45 PM

A simple meal featuring hot, home-made vegetable soup, bread and veggies prepared by Chuck Curley, assisted by Jill Curley.

A fun and entertaining program to prepare you for Advent involving stories, music, and fun. Children and youth will leave supper a little early and work with Ned on some singing and handbells for the program. Younger children (ages 3, 4, and Kindergarten) will have a special Christmas Crafts activity in Rooms 103 & 100 led by some of our Stay and Play teachers.

Sundays of Advent

The actual season of Advent begins on November 30 and our worship services will include the traditional Advent wreath lighting, special banners, increasing decorations, and preaching and music on Advent themes.

Advent Organ Recital Series

For the third year, we will present an Advent Organ Recital Series on Wednesday afternoons (December 3, 10, 17) beginning at 12:10 PM. The recital will last 25-30 minutes and be followed by a simple lunch. The recitals will be presented by various organists and give you a time to reflect and pray during the season of Advent.

Christmas Candlelight Services

The 81st Annual Christmas Candlelight Services will take place on Sunday, December 14 at 4:00 & 7:00 PM. This year the Candlelight Choir and Orchestra will present "Festival of Carols" by Joseph Martin. This work follows the order of the traditional Lessons and Carols service but in a more contemporary setting. Many familiar carols are included as well as some new carols. In fact over 20 carols are referenced in the service.

To keep good boats reliable we tend them regularly and plan ahead for their renewal. We're excited to be joining together in this endeavor. Now is the time to prayerfully consider how you will support the annual campaign and renewal. The FISH kids are making the cookies themselves on Nov. 8th. We ask that you pre-order your cookies by getting in touch

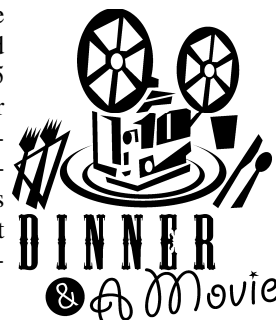

Class descriptions:

"Fresh Insights into the New Testament" Jennifer Greer continues this four week series. It brings new insights into how we view the Bible's context and development. Jennifer will engage us in fascinating ways as to how we perceive the New Testament, with focus on the culture of the time as revealed in related writings and archeology. We meet in Westminster Hall on Nov. 2nd and in Room 10 on Nov. 9th and 16th.

"Amazing Grace: the Movie and Discussion" This five-week series concludes on Nov. 2nd with John Rodgers and Sam Lush moderating. Each week features 30 minutes of this absorbing film followed by discussion. Emphasis is given to William Wilberforce, an anti-slaver within the British Parliament in the late 1700's and early 1800's. He was instrumental in working toward the abolishment of slavery in British society which no doubt influenced the slavery issue in America. The class meets in Room 10.

"Our Church's 2009 Capital Campaign" Staff members will introduce the reasons and scope of the new capital campaign planned for early 2009. There will be ample time for discussion with church members. More details of this session will be available closer to the presentation on Nov. 9th in Westminster Hall.

"Connecting U.S. Doctors with Developing World Patients" Khanjan Metha is a Senior Research Associate in the College of Engineering. He works with a unique technical

communications system to enable doctors in the USA to collect essential information on needy patients at a distance in East Africa. Medical professionals here can review this information and respond with treatment recommendations to the nearest doctor in the patient's home country. This process greatly leverages a U.S. doctor's ability to reach out to patients geographically removed. Learn details in Westminster Hall.

"The Divine Assignment" We are invited to a mini-retreat in Westminster Hall! Joel Blunk, Fish leaders and kids will share their fall retreat experiences with the congregation. Come and learn about "The Divine Assignment: Identifying Our God-Given Strength and Passion". See pictures, hear the music, view the giant tapestry. Come away with the chance of identifying your own Divine Assignment!
