

Dear Friends in Christ,

Peggy and I are thrilled to have a once-in-a-career opportunity because of the great generosity of the congregation in providing a sabbatical leave.

We have been invited by our long-time friend Rev. Baranite Kirata, the Moderator of the Kiribati Protestant Church to visit the Republic of Kiribati in the Central Pacific region. We will travel there via Hawaii, with a brief stop on Kirimati before making our way to Tarawa, the main island. Peggy and I will be leading a seminar for pastors on Tarawa, and I will also be preaching on the islands of Maiana and Abaiang. Abaiang was where the Rev. Hiram Bingham became the first missionary to visit Kiribati in the 1850's. We were close to his grandson Bruce when we were students at Yale.

Kiribati is one of the poorest and most isolated countries in the world. It is expected to be the first country to be completely inundated by sea level rise due to climate warming. We will be listening and learning the stories of these people whose culture and way of life are very much under threat. How does faith inform their struggles? We will be bringing resources for their theological school and for children's Christian education, made possible by gifts from our congregation.

Peggy and I will be in Kiribati for just over two weeks before we go to New Zealand for rest and relaxation. We will have the opportunity to visit the site of the Masjid massacre in Christchurch, to worship with Presbyterians there, and to learn about and observe the considerable efforts toward sustainability in New Zealand.

On returning to the US, I will be working on various presentations, including a talk entitled "Homiletic Strategies for Preaching on the Climate Crisis." I look forward to being able to share stories here and with other congregations about our time in Kiribati and will be traveling to make some of those talks after returning to the US.

I will be back in the church office the third week of March in order to welcome our Henszey speaker for 2019, and I look forward to seeing the LOGOS Spring musical as well before I resume my regular Sunday duties on Palm Sunday.

While I am away, we have a wonderful group of preachers lined up to lead worship. For pastoral needs, Michael Ozaki will be available, and since the Ozaki family is expecting a new arrival, the Rev. Al Wilson has kindly offered his assistance as a backup in emergency situations. Our office staff is happy to field any calls from the congregation and to help direct help where it needs to go. As always, we have a dedicated group of elders and deacons who will be carrying forward much of the ministry, and they also would be happy to be called upon by members of the congregation who are aware of any particular needs.

Peggy and I are so grateful for your support, and we do covet your prayers, just as we will be praying regularly for you while we are away.

Sunday, January 5, 9:00 and 11:15 AM Celebration of Epiphany Communion Scott Kretchmar, preaching

Scott Kretchmar is a member and elder of our congregation currently serving on Session. Scott has gone through the Commissioned Lay Pastor training program of Huntingdon Presbytery and regularly preaches at other churches in our Presbytery. He is an emeritus professor in the Department of Kinesiology at Penn State. During his career, he has published research in the areas of the philosophy and values of physical activity, the ethics of sport, and games and the evolution of human intelligence.

Paul Cho is a member of our congregation along with his wife Eunice and son Timothy. He is an Associate Professor of Hebrew Bible at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC, where he has taught since 2013. Paul did his undergraduate and seminary studies at Yale and completed his PhD at Harvard. He recently published a book through Cambridge Press entitled, "Myth, History, and Metaphor in the Hebrew Bible."

Sunday, January 26, 9:00 and 11:15 AM Third Sunday after Epiphany Daniel Falk, preaching


Daniel Falk grew up in Saskatchewan where he attended a Lutheran church. He majored in biblical studies in college and pastored a rural Baptist church for a couple years, before moving to the UK to do a PhD in ancient Judaism at Cambridge University and a post-doc at Oxford University. He researches and writes on the Dead Sea Scrolls. He was Professor of Biblical Studies and Ancient Judaism at the University of Oregon before moving to Penn State, where he is Chaiken Family Chair in Jewish Studies and Professor of Classics and Ancient Mediterranean Studies.


Thank You


The Most Fun at SCPC







Stay & Play Parents Kindergarten Night
