Doug grew up in Ithaca, NY in the Presbyterian Church. He attended the University of Maine, spent some time working for Caterpillar near Chicago then moved back to Maine where he and Janet met. They moved to State College in 1990 for Doug to pursue an advanced degree at Penn State. They had planned to return to Maine but stayed in State College where Doug worked at, and has since retired from, the Penn State Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering. Doug is an ordained Elder. They have a small farm and farm stand on their property on W. Gatesburg Rd.

Janet grew up in Maine, as a preacher's kid, in the UCC church. When they moved to State College, Janet also pursued an advanced degree and served as a school psychologist in Philipsburg, PA and then as a preschool psychologist. They have accumulated a family of six children and now four grandchildren. They tried several different churches in town before settling at Pine Grove Mills. They have made the move to SCPC to support their grandchildren's need for a church that is open and affirming. Janet is currently volunteering with the LOGOS program.

Tony grew up in State College and has been an active part of SCPC since 8th grade. While attending the Friends School he realized he needed a group of friends outside of school and found the Chrysalis program. During high school, he was active in FISH, and served as a leader in training with LOGOS GECK-OS. Tony grew up in the foster care system until his adoption and was happy to re-connect here at SCPC with Katie Nurmi who was a previous foster mother. He graduated from High School in 2019 then took a gap year where he was in the Young Adult Volunteer program of the Presbyterian Mission and was working with the homeless population in Ashville, NC. That got cut short when COVID hit in early 2020. He just finished his first semester at Penn State Altoona in the college of Health and Human Development, and serves as a FISH leader.


