



Calling a Senior Pastor: Next Steps

The Pastor Visioning Team is wrapping up its work in the coming month. The next steps in calling a new Senior Pastor may not be familiar to everyone, and so I would like to share a bit about the next steps and how the search for a new Senior Pastor should progress. The Pastor Vi-

sioning Team will present their report at a congregational meeting. The report will express what the team has learned about our congregation and it's leadership needs moving forward. The congregation will be asked to review and endorse their report as the vision to guide the selection and call of a Senior Pastor. The Pastor Visioning Team will be dismissed with thanks and the responsibility for conducting the active search for the candidate will be entrusted to a Pastor Nominating Committee. Our Nominating Committee is already at work prayerfully discerning who God is calling to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee. They will present a slate of seven members for election at the same congregational meeting.

The Pastor Nominating Committee will consist of a broad spectrum of actively engaged members and officers. Each member of the Pastor Nominating Committee will be called to participate as a representative of the whole congregation. The Pastor Nominating Committee is not intended to represent every particular group or demographic present in our congregation. They are advocates for the whole congregation not a particular group, and must be willing to attend to and consider the needs of all members and consider the needs of the congregation as a unified community of faith. The committee will conduct an active search, communicate regularly with the congregation during that search, and maintain confidentiality concerning the candidates they are considering, and coordinate with the session the call of a congregational meeting to consider the candidate they believe God is calling to be our next Senior Pastor.

Many members are passionately interested in being directly involved in the active search. Not all will be called to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee. But as people of faith we may trust that God is working through those who are called to reveal and identify our next Senior Pastor. Everyone who has participated in a Pastor Visioning listening session has already made a significant contribution to the process. As the committee is called and elected and as they pursue their work we will be asked to play another important role by surrounding them with prayer, respecting their commitment to confidentiality in the process, and guarding the space that they need to do their work from external anxiety and pressure. May God's hand strengthen our faith, renew our minds, and reassure our hearts as we actively work toward extending and confirming God's call of our next Senior Pastor.

Adult Explorations for February

All Sundays, Connect, Room 10, led by Bizz and Zack Maser, and Jamie Bauman

February 5, Westminster Hall. The Underground Railroad Museum, led by Candace Dannaker

The Borough of Bellefonte played a major role in the Underground Railroad, which was a network of people who assisted enslaved African Americans escape slavery. The "railroad" was active in the 19th century and Bellefonte's location was strategic to helping people who were attempting journeys to the Northeast, the Midwest and to Canada. Join Candace Dannaker in an exploration of this history. Ms. Dannaker is the former mayor of Bellefonte and current resident of the Samuel Harris House, which was a stop on the Railroad.

February 12, Westminster Hall. African tradition to African American Art, led by Heather Bruhn

Join Heather Bruhn as she provides an overview of some of the traditions brought over by enslaved Africans and their transformation into African American art. We'll look at meaningful motifs and traditions as well as contemporary responses to the legacy of slavery, emancipation, and the fight for Civil Rights.

February 19, Westminster Hall. For you were strangers in the land of Egypt, led by Jennifer Van Hook

A passage in Leviticus reminds us that many of our ancestors were societal outsiders, akin to many immigrants today: "The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens...for you were strangers in the land of Egypt" (Lev. 19:33-34). Many people in our community can trace their ancestry in the United States to immigrants who arrived several generations ago as poor laborers and subsequently experienced phenomenal success. In this session, we will explore how these immigrant success stories shape how we think about ourselves and our responses to immigrants today.

Saint Valentine


St. Valentine, (died 3rd century, Rome; feast day February 14), name of one or two legendary Christian martyrs whose lives seem to be historically based. Although the Roman Catholic Church continues to recognize St. Valentine as a saint of the church, he was removed from the General Roman Calendar in 1969 because of the lack of reliable information about him. He is the patron saint of lovers, epileptics, and beekeepers.

By some accounts, St. Valentine was a Roman priest and physician who suffered martyrdom during the persecution of Christians by the emperor Claudius II Gothicus about 270. He was buried on the Via Flaminia, and Pope Julius I reportedly built a basilica over his grave. Other narratives identify him as the bishop of Terni, Italy, who was martyred, apparently also in Rome, and whose relics were later taken to Terni. It is possible these are different versions of the same original account and refer to only one person.

According to legend, St. Valentine signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended and healed from blindness. Another common legend states that he defied the emperor's orders and secretly married couples to spare the husbands from war.
