

# Lenten Message from our Director of Education, Deannine Shipman


We wanted to offer something for families to read and do together to celebrate and learn during the season of LENT. In early February, you will find a booklet of devotions and activities, for anyone who would like it, available for you to take home! Copies will be at the back of the

sanctuary and at the Welcome Desk/Office just before Lent begins which is Ash Wednesday, February 14th. Here is a description:

#### An Illustrated Lenten Devotional Booklet for Families: This is My Body is an opportunity for families to

take time each week during Lent to be intentional and focus on their faith.

Our theme explores how Jesus lived in his body on earth and invites us to take care of—and embrace the goodness of—our own bodies. Each week highlights a different story from Jesus' life and connects it to shared human experiences—like growing up, taking naps, or drinking water. By engaging with



these stories through a broad lens of embodiment, "**This is My Body**" seeks to inspire curiosity, wonder, and awe in all ages.

We hope this Lenten family resource will help you share in conversation about how God came to be human and live among us.

#### What You Will Receive

- Seven Family Devotions: Weekly family devotions include a suggested scripture to read, a short reflection, discussion questions, an activity, a fun fact and a prayer.
- **Coloring & Activity Pages**: Each session comes with a coloring page that goes along with the Bible story, and an activity page.
