

- Pastor Allison will be taking some pre-scheduled study leave from April 3rd to April 9th.
- Rev. Mary Morrow will preach on Sunday, April 7th.
- Pastor Scott's first Sunday in worship will be April 14th.


LOGOS Musical 2024 ~ Palm Sunday






Maundy Thursday ~ March 28 Shared Meal and Service at 6:00 pm (In-Person Only)

The Juniper Village Block Party in April






During Lent there will be two active mission opportunities:
