

Virtual Maundy Thursday Worship

Maundy Thursday is remembering the night Jesus gathered around the table with his disciples, the intimate washing of feet, and the offering of body and blood. This year, while our gathering will be virtual, we hope to create space for genuine connection with reflective moments, small group sharing, and a shared communion meal. We hope you will join us on **April 1st at 7:00 PM via Zoom!** Please have your communion elements prepared beforehand so we can partake together.

Good Friday Word and Music

A simple service of the reading of the Passion of Our Lord according to the Gospel of John interspersed with organ music for Good Friday. The Gospel story will be read by members of SCPC. The service will be available on the State College Presbyterian YouTube Channel.

Good Friday Walk Through Experience

This year we will be offering a "Good Friday Walk-Through Experience" inspired by the work of Rev. Emily Scott (<u>found here</u>) based on the Stations of the Cross. From Noon – 8:00 PM you are invited to walk through different areas of the church (with 'Covid-19 Safe' distancing), each focusing on part of the Crucifixion story using readings, activities and contemporary images of struggle and pain to help us contemplate and experience the story of Jesus' saving work in our modern world and lives.

Holy Saturday Prayer Vigil

Holy Saturday is a day of hopeful anticipation and we invite you to spend the day in prayer with us. April 3rd we will be opening up the sanctuary to those who want a place to pray from 9:00 AM-3:00 PM. Please come in through the Fraser St. entrance. Masks and 6' distancing will be required. The sanctuary will also be streamed live via our YouTube channel so you can tune in virtually from your home during the same hours. Find the link on our website.

Celebration of the Resurrection

As we have been doing for the last year, there will be a recorded Easter service available on YouTube to join in the worship of our risen Lord. We are also planning outdoor services on Easter morning at Windswept Farm thanks to the kindness of Duke and Monica Gastiger, owners and proprietors of the ReFarm Café at Windswept Farm.

A 7:00 AM sunrise service will be led by the Explore group (young people exploring their faith with adult mentors) under the direction of Mike Ozaki. A 10:00 AM service will also be held, led by Dean Lindsey and Ned Wetherald.

Each service will last for a half an hour and worshippers will all be masked and remain distanced from one another, since many members have not yet received their vaccines.

What to Bring: Please bring a folding chair for seating, and we suggest wearing warm clothing and appropriate footwear for walking in wet grass. We will be seated widely in a beautiful field below the gazebo. The walk to the field may be muddy if there has been rain. Please pray for good weather!

How to Get there: From State College, take Fox Hollow Road towards the airport. Prior to reaching the main entrance to the airport, take a left off of Fox Hollow onto S. Fillmore Rd. Go 1.1 miles on Fillmore and you will see the sign on the left for the ReFarm Café at Windswept Farm.

Parking: Parking is limited, but deacons will be in the parking lot to help direct you and squeeze all of the cars into the space.

Special Congregational Meeting

A Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, April 18 at 11.00 AM on Zoom. The purpose of the meeting is to act upon the recommendation of the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee to call Allison Maus as our Associate Pastor for College and Young Adult Ministries for a designated term of three years. This is an important step in which our congregation is blessed to play a part, nearing the end of a long process leading to the ordination of Allison to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament. Following the successful vote of the congregation, Allison will be examined before the Presbytery on April 20. We look forward to the actual service of ordination later in June.

Caring for God's Creation Worship on April 25

In April of each year, on the Sunday closest to Earth Day, our Sustainability Circle helps the congregation to pause and give thanks to God for the good earth we have been given and to consider the role we play within it as stewards and caretakers. This year, our Scripture reading for the day will be from Psalm 139, "I am fearfully and wonderfully made," as a way to acknowledge that the creation is not simply something that surrounds us, but also is within us. God has blessed us with wonderful bodies, but, unfortunately, the bad things we do to the environment end up within our bodies. One example is the level of plastic that we ingest on a daily basis because there is now so much of it in our water and the food chain. We ask God for healing and direction as we seek to heal and renew our bodies as we seek to honor all of God's creation.

Good Friday Walk

Inspired by The Stations Of The Cross, we will be offering a "Good Friday Walk," Noon through 8:00 PM. Starting in the parking lot entrance, you are invited to take part in a self-guided journey through different rooms in the church where stations will be waiting for you to experience. Each station will focus on a different part of Jesus' crucifixion story using readings, activities and contemporary images of struggle and pain to help us contemplate and experience the story of Jesus' saving work in our modern world and lives.

Participants can move through the experience at a pace of their choice, but with 13 stations, it is expected to take 30-45 minutes (similar to a worship service).

No reservations are needed. The walk through is open Noon - 8:00 PM to allow ample room and time between participants. A host will also be present at the entrance to help guide you upon arrival

All participants must wear masks at all times. Only 1 'group' will be allowed at a station at a time.

No live actors or presenters are involved. Each station will have images, readings or simple actions to help guide prayer and contemplation.

Eligibility is based on...

Need – Current housing has health, safety or affordability issues. Current housing is too small (e.g., fewer bedrooms than needed for the size of the family).

Income – Family income falls within 40-80% of median income for Centre County

Willingness to contribute 350 hours of "sweat equity" and participate in homeowner education programs


Having lived OR worked in Centre County for at least 1 year
