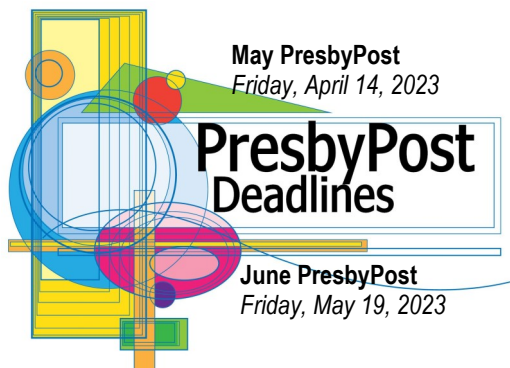

Pastor Nominating Committee

On March 19th at a congregational meeting called by the Session we received and endorsed the final report of the Pastor Visioning Team. This meeting provided an opportunity for members to ask questions or express concerns about the vision presented by that report of our need for Pastoral leadership in this next season of ministry, and the characteristics of a good candidate for the position of Senior Pastor. The Pastor Visioning Team was thanked for their work and having fulfilled its responsibilities was dismissed.

The congregation then unanimously elected a slate of nominees to conduct the active search for a pastoral candidate for the position of Senior Pastor. This Pastor Nominating Committee has already been contacted and is getting organized with the help of the Huntingdon Presbytery Committee on Ministry. It will draft a formal Ministry Information Form which will be entered into a national database of pastoral candidates and ministry positions that congregations are seeking to fill.

In its consideration of candidates, the committee will be looking for candidates whose training, experience, and gifts for leadership match the need envisioned in the report. The national database is overseen by the Church Leadership Connection which will sort candidates and notify the Committee on Ministry of those that might be a good match. These will be the starting point for the PNC's consideration. The committee will look for a candidate who is a good fit for the position. While some candidates might appear to be a good match on paper, through interviews the PNC will zero in on candidates that have values, ministry goals, and a theological perspective that are compatible with our congregation. They will be looking for a candidate that has the right disposition, and chemistry to fit well with our unique community of faith. This is important and exciting work. It is also demanding. Please keep the members of the Pastor Nominating Committee in your prayers regularly throughout the active search. Giving them the space and time to do their work while consistently offering your support and encouragement will make a significant difference. Below is a prayer reminder that you can cut and paste in a conspicuous place as a reminder.

Pray for the members of the Pastor Nominating Committee: God bless Jamie Bauman, Bob Igo, Rob Leicht, Laura Millard, Jerry Sawyer, Katie Stone, and Steve VanHook. 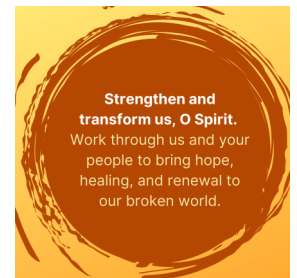
This cleanup crew cleaned **1.1 miles** of North Atherton roadside during Clearwater Conservancy's Watershed Cleanup day: **11 bags of trash in 4 hours!**

The Sustainability Circle invites you to consider becoming part of the SCPC team that will participate in **Clearwater Conservancy’s annual Watershed Cleanup day** on Saturday, April 22nd (Earth Day) from 8:00 AM to noon.

We expect to spend four hours of hard but rewarding work picking up trash along a local waterway – lots of bending over and getting dirty or muddy. We will be assigned a route and given trash bags, safety vests, disposable gloves, and a location along the route to drop off the filled bags. The event is more suitable for adults and older kids, since it requires attention and effort, and some sites are near roadways; younger kids could participate with close parental supervision. There are already a few members of the Sustainability Circle, FISH, and YoPro planning to participate. We’d love to have you join us!

Collections for Disaster Cleanup Buckets (used by Church World Service) and for **One Great Hour of Sharing** (supporting Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Presbyterian Hunger Program, and the Presbyterian Committee for the Self-Development of All People) continue through Easter. For One Great Hour of Sharing donations, envelopes can be found in pews, or you can memo OGHS on your check, or find the OGHS category on the [online giving page](#). Bucket contributions may be specific [items from the list](#), or monetary donations to cover the bucket processing fee (write BUCKETS on the memo line of your check, or use OTHER for your [online donation](#)).

In preparation for filling the cleanup buckets, [items should be delivered by 4/16](#), the Sunday after Easter. You may help fill the buckets by [purchasing specific items locally](#), [purchasing them online](#), for delivery directly to the church office, or contributing to the per-bucket processing cost.

The buckets are standardized and filled with the specific things listed, and sealed, so that they can be moved easily and quickly across borders to where they are needed. Thanks to Liv Mortimore, we have a [Signup Genius](#) to ensure that we get just the right number of each item. You can sign yourself up to bring in an item, or you can call the church office for assistance. If you take a [shopping list](#) out with you, please do make sure to sign up for the items you purchase before or immediately after you purchase them!

Out of the Cold has just moved out of the shelter, because construction is finally beginning – timed to coincide with the Big of South Atherton Big Dig this spring, which will save OOTC a great deal on necessary sewer and water upgrades.

Out of the Cold building maintenance leader Jay Aubuchon is assembling a corps of 12-18 of adult volunteers to serve as painters between May 26 and June 6. Volunteers must have flexible schedules, and be mostly available between those dates. Please [let Cricket know if you are interested](#), and she'll put you in touch with the right person.

We have our 2023 Out of the Cold hosting dates! Mark your calendars for **June 12-25**, and let Cricket or members of the Social Justice Mission Team know if you'd [like to help assemble hosting or cleanup teams](#).

After success reducing their waiting list toward the end of 2022, Out of the Cold has experienced a surge of need, and now has a waitlist of 60, which continues to be more than 90% Centre Countians. Please pray for our neighbors who are unhoused, for those in unstable housing situations, and for all who are working to create more safe, affordable, accessible shelter in our area.

Our pilot **Juniper Village Block Party** was a huge success! On February 26, the Masers, Richardsons, and Bill Lukens and Cheryl Price joined 6 members of the SCPC community who gather on Sunday afternoons to watch Sunday's services. Immediately following the service, we enjoyed lots of conversation, a few games, some tasty homemade snacks, and terrific music led by Zack Maser.

Resurrection Faith

Pascha [or Easter] is the central event, the time of transformation, of becoming a resurrected people, God's new people. On this Sunday of all Sundays, Pascha, we celebrate our transformation as a new people. When Christ rose from the grave, death and all other "principalities and powers" that seek to entomb God's will were forever defeated.

Easter is not simply the miracle of a dead person raised from the grave, but a celebration of power that can shatter death in order that people can freely serve the God of life. In the resurrection of Christ, God's awesome purposes were on display, revealing a radically new world of peace and harmony and equality and mutuality, about which we can only dream. The Lord of the future has been disclosed to us. Both the incarnation at Christmas and the resurrection at Easter testify to the lordship of Christ. ...

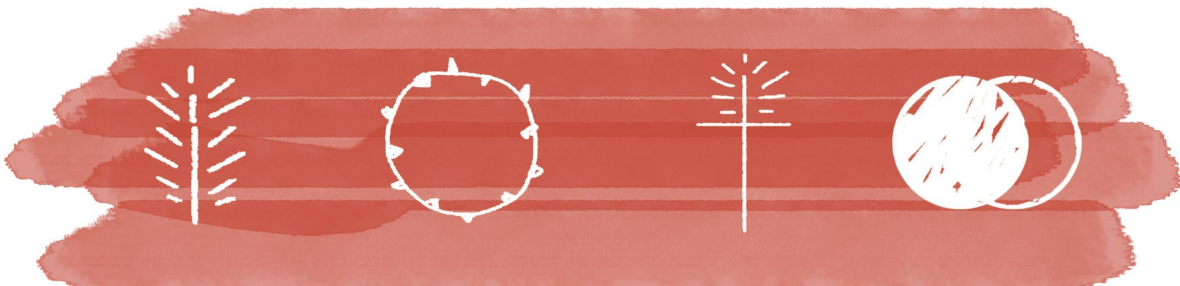
On Easter we glimpse a new landscape — the age to come — and experience a sense of holy awe at the significance of the resurrection for human life. The shape of the age to come reveals a new people of God, a new humanity.



When Christ was crucified, humanity died with him on Calvary. But on Easter morning, a new world was born — raised up with the crucified and risen Christ. Bursting the bonds of death, the first human being of a new human race, Jesus Christ, appeared among those who crucified him. In the midst of the old sin-struck world, God gave the world a new beginning, a new humanity. By faith the old guilt-ridden humanity was born again into the new forgiven humanity of Jesus Christ. Ever since, here and there, clusters of the new people of God live according to the new social order of the new age.

Therefore, Easter faith recalls the past, especially the awesome act of God in raising the crucified Christ from the grave. Easter hope looks to the promised future, to that which awaits us. Easter love celebrates the presence of the crucified and risen Christ who is now among us, reconciling us as one people. Resurrection faith asserts that by grace we are born again into the new humanity of Jesus Christ. We are called to new life for God and for neighbors. As representatives of the new humanity we walk in newness of life.
