Senior Pastor Search

s we celebrate the resurrection through this season of Easter there are many things that reflect on God's work to renew and restore. We are also entering a dynamic phase of our movement from our former pastoral partnership with Dean Lindsey and the new pastoral relationship we are looking for in a new Senior Pastor. Late in March we receive a clear statement of direction for that search in the Pastor Visioning Team report and elected a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to conduct the active search. The members of the PNC. Jamie Bauman, Bob Igo, Rob Leicht, Laura Millard, Jerry Sawyer, Katie Stone, and Steve VanHook have begun meeting weekly. Two representatives of Huntingdon Presbytery, Ken Raney and Terry Musser, are advising them. They are preparing an official listing which describes the church and the position we are seeking to fill. After this Ministry Information Form (MIF) is posted on a national database, they will be reading and reviewing ministers' Personal Information Forms (PIF), contacting potential candidates, and conducting interviews. Since some potential candidates may currently be serving churches while exploring the possibility of a different call, the PNC will not be sharing information about specific candidates under consideration. They will be sharing updates with the congregation periodically in the PresbyPost and in worship. You can make a significant contribution to the process and offer meaningful support by paying attention to the information shared and praying for the PNC. If we all understand how the process provides and enhances the opportunity for finding a new Senior Pastor who will be a good "fit" for State College Presbyterian Church, then our fellowship will be strengthened and we can all contribute more meaningfully to the new future God is calling us into. Thank you in advance for your attention, engagement, and prayerful support.

Financial Affairs Report

Thanks to strong contributions through March 2023, we are thrilled to let everyone know that we are currently over 35% of our total pledge goal for the year! Our 2023 Giving stands at a total of \$294,543 versus our annual goal of \$775,000; this figure includes prepaid (in 2022) pledge contributions plus those received in January through March 2023. Sustained weekly giving at this level will keep us ahead of the curve. On the expense side, we are at 24% of our total spending budget which is tracking slightly under for the total year (\$241,113 spent of a total annual budget of \$1,004,200).

We are very appreciative of everyone's generosity; you all help SCPC to offer programming for all ages and maintain a church building that is open to all of our members. Although many continue to give traditionally, we do also offer several different methods for giving, including online and ACH options:

- By check mailed to the church
- By direct bank e-check/bill pay (contact your bank)
- Through our online giving option: QR code below with your smart phone or click the "give now" button on our website (scpresby.com)
- ACH/direct debit option: visit our website for instructions or email Michelle (<u>finadmscpc@gmail.com</u>)

Processing will occur on the 1st and 15th of each month; you may choose either (or both) days and one-time, monthly, or quarterly processing.

ACH processing occurs at no fee to SCPC.


June 12-June 26

Many blessings and thanks to all who share their love of Christ, and knowledge with others!




Congratulations!
