The helicopters arrived May 23 and began spraying for spongy moth at Krislund. All forested acreage, which is 862 acres, will be sprayed for a fee of \$24,900. Krislund raised \$13,750 and the balance was pledged by SCPC.

Betio is a dense and bustling urban area, and this new congregation is literally bursting at the seams. They currently worship in an open air pavilion, and they are very excited about having the opportunity to build a new church in which to worship and grow as a community of faith.

Dean will be explaining some of the challenges the people there face, but also the opportunity for faithful witnesses there to do great things with God's help, and ours!

Sunday, June 12, 11:15 AM Reflections on the Psalms

The conclusion of Daniel Falk's three part series. The book of Psalms has been one of the most beloved parts of Scripture for Christians throughout history. Christians have found in these poems comfort in times of distress, a source of profound meditation on God, creation and the human condition, and even prophetic visions of Jesus. But the Psalms are disturbing and difficult as well as beautiful, and Christians have struggled to know what to do with the violent and ugly bits which are rarely read in the church. Daniel will reflect on C.S. Lewis's Reflections on the Psalms, bringing us closer to grappling with difficulties in the Psalms.

Session Highlights May 2022

Much of what Session did in May was brainstorming on particular issues:

- Heard positive report of today's church picnic, organized by the Deacons. Discussed ideas for making a monthly gathering of the church around shared food, with different groups doing the work.
- Sunday School: Discussed ways of bolstering fall enrollment.
- Stay & Play: Laura Steager's last day as the director is June 10. Personnel announced the hiring of Laura Seeley as her successor.
- Local missions: Heard that SJMT sent checks for \$1,000 each to eleven local agencies piggybacking on Centre Gives days.
- Out of the Cold: Church will host OOTC from June 27 to July 10. Session brainstormed ways of offering more church folks the opportunity to participate in the hosting tasks.
- Two new members were received at the May Second Sunday joining.
- Worship timing: Session offered ideas on the timing of services and Coffee Hour for the summer and beyond.




Stay & Play Wraps Up Another Year
