Pastor Nominating Committee June Update

Last month, Pastor John outlined the process: "They (PNC) are preparing an official listing which describes the church and the position we are seeking to fill. After this Ministry Information Form (MIF) is posted on a national database, they will be reading and reviewing ministers' Personal Information Forms (PIF), contacting potential candidates, and conducting interviews." Our committee has met weekly since starting in April to complete the ministry information required to enter into the national database. The report prepared by the Pastor Visioning Team (presented to the congregation) is the foundation of our document. Our church's vision was tailored to fit the specific form (now called MDP) and will be submitted to Session for approval on May 21st. Once approved, it will be submitted to Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) for review and approval. If all goes as planned, we hope to upload our information into the national database in June. We will then begin to receive PIFs of pastors who meet our church's vision. In the interim, our committee will define our process for reviewing and ranking our candidates. We will keep the congregation regularly informed of our progress in the PresbyPost and monthly during a church service. We are grateful for the support of the congregation and understanding that once we receive PIFs, much of what we do will be confidential. We've had great support from Pastor John, the Personnel Committee, and church staff. As noted last month, we also have support and input from Ken Raney and Terry Musser from Presbytery. Finally, I'm thankful for the diligent, open, and thoughtful work of our PNC members. - Bob Igo

This newly forming, local interfaith group is exploring how local congregations might work to reduce gun violence. The group's first meeting was in mid-April, with a film, <u>Armor of Light</u> shown on the evening of May 21st at the UUFCC. The second organizing meeting took place here at SCPC on the following evening.

The proposed mission statement is *The Centre County Interfaith Coalition for Gun Safety is an alliance of local religious leaders and community members committed to building a peaceful society free from preventable gun violence. Through our work, we educate on issues related to gun violence, advocate for responsible and safe gun ownership, and unite with local, state, and federal officials on matters of gun safety that benefit the whole community.*


Sherlock Holmes' father has died, and he is in need of a new case to take his mind off their failed relationship.

Holmes is then contacted to help resolve the deadly plot, and the game is afoot!


