



In September, the congregation will be participating in an important effort to help folks who are in the early stages of recovery from a natural disaster, and there have been several significant ones in the news recently, including floods in Tennessee and the earthquake in Haiti. In these and similar situations, Church World Services and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance are always quick to respond, offering immediate and ongoing support.

Due to the generosity of churches such as our own Church World services is able to rush ready-made Emergency Cleanup Buckets right to those who need them most. Several years ago, following Hurricane Harvey, our church made a large collection of these buckets, and we'd like to do so again this year.

Covid Precautions

We continue to exercise pandemic precautions during worship services with participants remaining masked during the service. We ask worshippers to leave adequate space between themselves and neighbors and never to come to worship if they have any symptoms of illness. Windows in the sanctuary remain open during the service with the attic fan providing strong circulation of outside air.

The Session carefully considers and approves any major changes to our worship life subject to the guidance of our Medical Advisory Team. Members of the team are Anne Layng (chair), Rob Huffard, Tim Williamson, Jen Tothero, and Kristin Frank Dixon. Earlier in the summer, as the pandemic seemed to be loosening its grip, the team advised us to continue with mask wearing, and we are now thankful for that wise counsel since cases in the area have subsequently increased.

Still, the virus is out there, and we had one recent incident where someone tested positive the day after they attended a Sunday morning worship. This person had been vaccinated, had a "very mild" case, and recovered quickly. The Medical Advisory Team, as always, was able to guide us in responding, providing information quickly to the congregation. Those who were seated near the member were informed, and, to our knowledge, no one else was infected.


