





Once a month we will combine all children for a special MUSIC experience with our own Ned Wetherald.



Wandering Women in September

All women of the church are invited to join the Wandering Women hike on Saturday, September 17, at Bald Eagle State Park. Ann Wheeler will be leading the hike and will go directly to the park. For those of you who plan to carpool, Cheryl Price will be at the church parking lot at 8:30. (Please email her at <u>clprice73@gmail.com</u> so she knows to expect you.) We will be walking the Butterfly Trail, an easy two mile walk,



mostly flat and on mown grass. (If it turns out to be very warm and sunny, we can change the route a little to give us more shade.)

To get to the park, once you reach the intersection of I-80 and PA150, drive 8.3 miles north and make a right turn onto Main Park Road. Go 6/10 of a mile and make a right onto Schenck's Grove Road,

which you will follow for about 800 feet as it becomes Beach Road and ends at a parking lot by the lake. Park on the east end of the parking lot, which will be to your left as you enter. Meet at the church at 8:30 to carpool, or at 9:15 at Bald Eagle State Park if you are going directly to the park. Dress for the weather, and consider sunscreen and/or insect repellent.

We usually hike in light rain but will cancel if the weather is stormy. Look for any cancellation information due to weather on SCPC Facebook and by email. If you have any questions, please contact Ann (annbehlenwheeler@gmail.com).

Food Bank

o you remember the times when State College Presbyterian Church made food contributions to the State College Food Bank on a routine basis? Somehow, SCPC got out of the habit and donations trickled to a handful. It's time to reinvigorate our regular contributions. It's time to be more mindful of the needs of those who depend on the Food Bank to supplement the diets and household needs of families and others in our community. Currently, the items listed by the Food Bank include: canned fruit and canned tomatoes, canned chicken and tuna, cooking oil, powdered lemonade mix, and non-food items such as laundry detergent, liquid dish and hand soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes and more. There are two collection locations in the church building; one is located in the benches at the Fraser Street entrance and the other is in the cabinets in the parking lot entrance. Deacons will transport the items to the Food Bank. Your help is greatly appreciated. Thank you.


