

Our "New" Steinway Piano

What do you do with an antique that still has life in it? You give it a second life!

When the Bellefonte Presbyterian Church closed its doors almost 2 years ago SCPC came into possession of a Steinway piano that had been destined for



disposal. In late June 2022 our church was gifted \$50,000 from the children of long-time members, Jo and Jim Keiser. Half of this generous gift was designated for the music program, the other half for Session discretion. With Session's support, the entire sum was directed to the restoration of this piano.

The well-known piano company, Cunningham in Philadelphia, came for the piano in August of 2022 and returned it totally refurbished last month. It now graces our sanctuary.

A bit about our Steinway – it is a Model M built circa 1922 and made of mahogany. The "bones" of it were in good shape which made restoration worthwhile. The price of restoration was \$44,000, and it is now valued at \$72,000. Today this piano would retail over \$118,000. We have been told that although our piano is 101 years old, she should be good to go for another 100 years! We will be dedicating the Steinway during worship November 26. The Keiser family plans to be here to celebrate.

Updating our Membership Directory

We are beginning work on an update to our Membership Directory. This directory, like previous church directories,

will provide updated photos and contact information. Yet it will be different from previous church directories in two ways. This directory will be available online and we will not be working with a professional photo directory studio to produce it.

The photos and information will be



entered into our church database which has the ability to provide an online directory of select contact information and photos that is updated in real-time. Access will be password protected to keep the information and photographs secure. It will be updated in real-time eliminating the need for a major update every couple of years. We will provide opportunities for people to update information and photos several times a year. In this way the most current information will be available to you. Those who would like to have a hard copy of the church directory will be able to request one from the office.

Volunteer photography teams will take the place of a professional studio. You will not be asked to purchase any photo packages and you will be given a copy of the digital photo for your personal use. These photos do not need to be formal and do not require making an appointment. Instead you may simply visit one of the photo stations after worship on one of the Photo Opportunity dates in the coming weeks.

Photo stations will be open following worship (from 10:00 am—noon) to provide opportunities for those who are participating in Exploration Hour to stop in after those programs end.
