



November Session Meeting Update

The November 14, meeting of session covered many topics:

- Received Report of the Youth Visioning Team on its survey of the congregation's vision of youth ministry (6th-12th grades) and staffing. Referred to Personnel Committee for its consideration.
- LOGOS is back in-person and will lead worship on November 21.
- Out of the Cold: Our week to provide shelter for clients is December 20-26. Session voted to follow the process of last year to fund hotel rooms for up to ten clients for the week, to provide safe shelter and protect the church and clients from COVID exposure.
- Authorized Personnel to draft an interim part-time job description and hire very temporary, very part-time staff to fill the gap in Social Justice & Mission Team coordination, created by the departure of Mike Ozaki, to provide connection between church and staff and church and community.
- Both CAYAM and Membership Ministry Units reported new in-person visitors.
- Advent and Christmas Eve programs and services were announced.
- Income and expenses are in-line and cash flow is positive.
- Approved updated financial policies to guide handling of cash receipts and disbursements and to guide our handling of investments, including designated and endowment funds. Authorized hiring a consultant to analyze and advise on our need for masonry repairs on the exterior of the building.
- Directed Building & Property to study and advise on safety upgrades in parking lot next to church.

HOME(less) for CHRISTMAS

Celebrating Christmas at home with family is a key holiday tradition for many in our country and around the world. In the days before Christmas, airports and highways are full of travelers who share "home" as a destination. For others however - even here in Centre County - Christmas at home is not an option.

This year SCPC will be hosting up to 20 homeless Out Of The Cold guests by providing hotel rooms for them from Dec 20 - Dec 26. A hotel room for the week provides 24/7 shelter from the elements, lets guests sleep in real beds (not army cots) and enjoy a hot shower - not to mention sleeping in a little later and TV. OOTC leadership will be organizing the hotel rooms. SCPC will cover hotel costs and provide meals during the week (as done last year). The SCPC Christmas dinner will be shared with these guests as well.

OOTC personnel will deliver meals to the hotel but are looking to volunteers from the SCPC congregation to provide the food. Donations for breakfast, lunch, or dinner should be dropped off at the Meeting House at 318 S. Atherton St. by 10AM each day; then individual meals will be prepared and brought to the hotel by 11:30AM.


In addition to food, help is needed each day at the Meeting House to divide "family style" food into individual meal portions: 40 per day for lunch and dinner alone!

Gift cards can also be donated. These will enable OOTC guests to buy food from local businesses during the Christmas weekend and relieve OOTC staff of meal delivery duties over the holiday.






