



Live streaming our worship services has put us on the doorstep of being able to explore the many enhancements that video segments and presentations can provide.

Please let us know if you are interested in helping put this new opportunity into effect. We think that anyone who has basic computer skills can fit easily into the kind of technology we now have and expect to have in the coming year. We'd like to gather a small group of 6-8 individuals who can share the duties on Sundays – alleviating the need for one or two people to carry that load by themselves – and perhaps only needing to be "at the controls" once a month or every other month.

Everyone is invited to participate. All you need is an interest in serving your congregation and being comfortable with simple technology – perhaps making it part of your gift to the church.

Initially, training on the equipment we now use will be provided. Once comfortable with that, the next step would be for everyone in the group to be part of the team that researches, acquires, installs, and learns how to operate the new design. Small steps, leading to a broader, more fulfilling means of providing our congregation with both a traditional and contemporary worship experience.

Along the way, we'll reflect on Advent themes in some carols, poems, and art.

If you use online giving, we want to remind you that you may need to update your recurring giving (if you are changing your pledge for 2023). Using our online giving system allows <u>you</u> to login and see your historical information at any time; our financial administrator does not have access to change your account information. You will also receive an end-of-the-year statement (via email) from the Presbyterian Foundation/Vanco showing your giving for the year as well as a contribution statement from SCPC which will list your online giving plus any non-online giving you may have done.

Finally, if you have set up a recurring gift to any of our past "seasonal" campaigns such as Peace & Global Witness, RGH, CROP Walk, etc, please know that, while we will continue to get these gifts to the right agencies and/or groups within SCPC, those giving lines generally have a limited timeframe for active contributions. acf/. Learn more about more than 30 charities, and make donations for yourself, or in honor of others. Anyone participating in person can pick up cards and envelopes (with the logo you see here) to share news of the gift with the people they have in mind. The Sustaina-

bility Circle and the Social Justice and Mission Team encourage you to check it out!



Angel Tree is under way now! Each angel represents a gift identified by local agencies and their clients that our neighbors would like to receive this year. Choose an angel with a gift you'd like to purchase on the bridge. (One angel = one string, with two pieces of paper.) Sign your name on the list next to the same number and description as the angel you chose. Hang one copy of each angel you chose on the tree, and keep the other copy to help you shop.

The angels for Out of the Cold represent about half our commitment to fund four nights of Christmastime housing for Out of the Cold at a local hotel. These nights provide some much-needed holiday respite for both clients and OOTC staff. Choose and hang your angel as usual, then donate via check or online donation to SCPC, memo OOTC Christmas. If

you wish to donate over and above the angel tag amount of \$25 or \$50 to help us meet our full commitment, there's no need to pick up additional angels simply add to your donated total. 15 rooms are needed, at a cost of \$30 per person (\$60 per room) per night.

Deliver your wrapped gifts with your paper angel attached, to the church ofanytime through fice December **12th.** Place them on the floor between the two desks in the main area (or, for




Pastor Vision Team Process Goals
