Our Advent 2023 Theme is "Attentiveness"



Advent reflections have frequently been guided and organized around four words that describe the character of what God is bringing into the world. Words like peace, joy, love, hope. But by focusing on the <u>character</u> of what or who is coming into the world through Christ's birth we become predisposed to noticing only those things that fit our expectations. In "Night Visions' Jan L. Richardson writes "The season of Advent means there is something on the horizon the likes of which we have never seen before...What is possible is to not see it, to miss it, to turn just as it brushes past you."

God is the one bringing the Kingdom into being. We are called to be alert and attentive so that we might not miss it. This year we invite you to stop preparing, stop fashioning images of peace, love, joy, hope, and instead turn your energy into attentiveness. Each week in worship we will open with a guided reflection on how we can use one of our senses to perceive God's presence and activity. You will have an opportunity to share a written response from your reflection during the offering. The responses from each week will add flame to one of four candle banners reminding us of the candles that we light in our advent wreath.

With new curiosity let's use all our senses to notice God's presence and activity in the world around us. Quiet yourself as you listen, cleanse your palate with water and simple bread so you really taste, take off your gloves and boots so you can actually feel, put away the scented candles to smell the world as it really is. Hear and respond to the invitation that Dietrich Bonhoeffer extends in "God is in the Manger" ~ "Just be aware, be watchful, wait just another short moment. Wait and something quite new will break over you: God will come."

#### **Pastor Search Update**

On April 10<sup>th,</sup> our PNC committee met for the first time. Since then, we have been coming together nearly every week in search of our new pastor.

We believe with God's grace and guidance our discernment and our effort will bring the right pastor to our church.

We started receiving candidates' information in June and since then

we have reviewed nearly 70 PDPs (Pastor Discernment Profiles). For the first six weeks or so, PDPs trickled into us and we were in an investigative and development mode. Our group learned about how the new church candidate matching system (CLC) worked and what we were seeing from candidates.

We've had first round of interviews and met with a number of people a second time. We started interviewing candidates in August and have had first and second round pastor meetings in November. We are finalizing our next steps as the field of nominees narrows. We will continue to evaluate PDPs as they come in so that we miss no potential leader for our congregation.

We will keep the congregation updated through these monthly reports and during worship. We appreciate the support and prayers of Session and the congregation. Finally, I'm thankful for the diligent, open, and thoughtful work of our PNC members.




## Director of Music Ministry Search Update

PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE

The Social Justice and Mission Team has chosen to direct the 2023 Christ Child Collection to **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance**, which provides humanitarian response and resilient rebuilding from natural disasters and conflict, both in the United States, and around the globe. Their current efforts include helping children and communities impacted by so many things we've seen on the news: war in Ukraine, Israel, Palestine, and Gaza; earthquakes in Afghanistan, Mexico, Turkey and Syria; wildfires in Hawaii; and hurricanes, cyclones, tornadoes, and floods in many regions, as well as many areas of need that rarely make it to our screens. **We are glad we will be able to help these helpers**.



Judging by the shrinking numbers of tags in the bins – and the growing decoration on the **Angel Tree** – many of you have already chosen recipients and started shopping. The bins will stay out until all the needs are filled.

If you're new to SCPCs Angel Tree you'll find signs around the church to help you find the tree, and directions are posted right there on the bridge.

Wrapped gifts are due in the church office by Sunday, December 10th. Please attach your tag firmly to the gift, so we can make sure it gets to its recipient! Watch the Weekly Update for opportunities to help transport gifts from the church to the receiving agencies.

Do you want to be part of the giving, but you can't get out as much as you'd like? Our Angel Tree gift to Out of the Cold is a few nights of hotel housing, providing guests with a change of pace, showers-without-lines, and a full sized bed, and providing staff with a few days of respite at Christmas, so that they can keep doing their extraordinary work all year long. While we do have Angel Tree tags to contribute toward that gift, we actually need to collect more than is on the tags, so you are welcome to simply write a check or make a donation on the SCPC website (memo:OOTC) ...and of course you can still hang an angel on a Sunday when you are able to be with us in person.

Out of the Cold is now fully installed in their renovated space on S. Atherton St., just a few blocks from the church. Congregations are still providing dinner and "hosting" (visiting for a couple of hours in the evening), but now dinners can be a bit earlier (7:00 pm), but it is **at the shelter**. Their new, permanent shelter also means that we have been able to split our two weeks of meal hosting, so that we will have one week in the winter, and one in the summer. **January 29th-February 4th** is our first week. We will have sign up links right away in January, but for now, **mark your calendars**, and start talking with your small groups and committees about working together to spend an evening providing dinner, visiting with guests, and dropping off breakfast items for the next morning.
