The Suffering Servant—Isaiah 52:13-53:9

Leader: See, my servant shall prosper; He shall be exalted and lifted up, and shall be very high.

People: Just as there were many who were astonished at him—so marred was his appearance, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of mortals—

Leader: He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth;

People: Like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

Leader: By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future?

People: For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people.

Leader: They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich,

People: Although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.
