**Krislund Plastic Lid Collection**

SCPC's Krislund volunteers are taking the winter months to turn our plastic lids and caps into benches for the camp. These Thursday volunteers usually do maintenance and projects around the camp, but winter is not a great time for that, so they are helping all of us by collecting clean plastic lids, and sorting them to send to a company that will turn them into durable plastic picnic tables.

Collect your plastic lids at home, and drop them into the collection boxes at all three main entrances. Most of the plastic caps and lids that regularly collect in your kitchen are among those that are accepted, but lids from takeout beverage cups are not accepted (keep carrying your water bottles and reusable mugs!). Do make sure you include only 100% plastic lids, with no metal or cardboard, please.
