**March 5: "Spiritual Disciplines"** led by Pastor John Porter. Richard Foster in "Celebration of Discipline" asserts "The classical Disciplines of the spiritual life call us to move beyond the surface of living into the depths... God intends [them] to be for ordinary human beings: people who have jobs, who care for children, who wash dishes and mow lawns. In fact, the Disciplines are best exercised in the midst of our relationships." In the two sessions we will have looked at the last of the twelve spiritual disciplines Foster covers in the text; Guidance, and Celebration will be covered today at 10:15 am in Westminster Hall.
