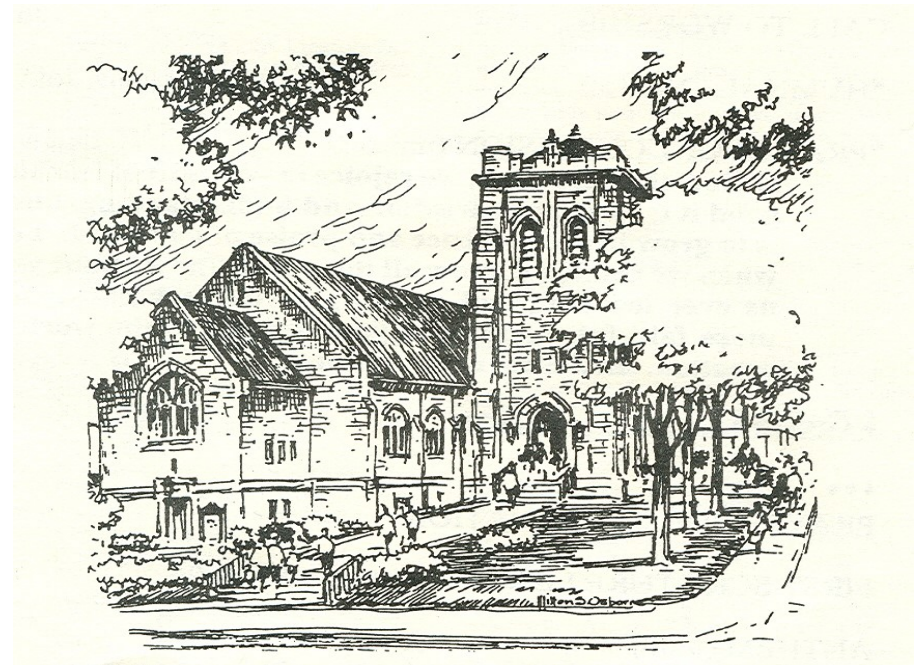
How can YOU support LOGOS this year?
