Scouts Leading a Hike with SCPC Children, Families, & Youth

The Scouts are offering an organized hike for Sunday, September 10th. This is for any of our children and youth to attend. 

Children in Worship

Unless parents make other arrangements, these children will be taken to their Pathways classrooms at the conclusion of worship.

Exploration Hour

PATHWAYS (Age 3 to grade 5) - From 10:00 am to 11:00 am, in room 210 on the upper level. This multi-age class is made to teach and accommodate all needs/ages. A pre-packaged snack will be served.

THE OASIS (grades 6-12) - From 10:15 am to 11:00 am, in the Fireside Room on the lower level. Oasis is a loving place where youth from 6th-12th grade can have fun, feel accepted, and grow.
